Dr. Trani opened the meeting with a slide presentation and brief run over the rules of engagement with the eight information stations and cookies for our guests. Dr. Trani gave news from around the region, with the cost per ADMr for each district from information in TSCC's Multnomah County jurisdiction for comparisons.
