## **NOTICE OF CONCERN**

As happens in the course of family and student life, discord and upset sometimes occurs. Recently, the school district, some staff members, and others in the community have been named in a lawsuit. It is destructive to circumvent due process and speculate based on incomplete information. Because of this the District will not respond to speculation posted in the social media.

Confidentiality rules sharply limit what those who are party to this lawsuit are allowed to say in public. However, to our community, we'd like to say:

*"The board appreciates your concern for students and families in the district. Please be assured that from the very first contact we had from the plaintiff in this lawsuit, the district acted under the direction and guidance of attorney Nancy Hungerford of the Hungerford Law Firm. We have at all times acted to protect the rights of parents, staff, and the student. As we all know, matters involving family relations are intensely private and we are unable to release much information in order to protect privacy rights of all involved. We ask that you remember that hearing one side of a dispute is rarely a complete or unbiased picture. The district is being represented in the lawsuit by attorneys retained by our liability insurance carrier. "*

## **CHILD FIND**

Public schools will ensure that all students with disabilities who are eligible for kindergarten through 21 years of age, residing within their attendance area, have available to them a free and appropriate public education in the least restrictive environment. The rights of children with disabilities and their parents will be protected in accordance with state and federal laws.

School districts must locate and identify individuals who have disabilities from birth to age 21. If you or someone you know has a child with a disability who may be in need of special education and related services, you can initiate a referral through your local schools.
