In order to maintain a strong academic focus in our classrooms, all electronic devices are to remain off and put away while classes are in session. Students may not use their mobile devices during class time without explicit permission from the teacher.

MS / HS DAYS EXTENDED BY 7 MINUTES

The middle school and high school days will be extended by seven minutes, running from 7:55 am - 3:47 pm. Lunch periods will remain the same. This will accommodate the Oregon Department of Education's phase-in of the State Board of Education's revised rules governing instructional time. Accordingly, bus schedules will bump out seven minutes. The grade school will dismiss as follows: Primary K-3 at 3:35 and Intermediate 4-5 at 3:40. CAPS will dismiss at 3:35.

BUS SAFETY & CODE of CONDUCT

It is getting close to the start of the school year and the Transportation Department is gathering all the necessary documents for Corbett School bus riders for the 2018-19 school year. These documents will be available at registration. The first document is the application for regular riders. Please take the time to fill this out completely with the most accurate information. The next two documents apply to policy for all students at Corbett School District. Please take the time to review the policies and procedures of being a Corbett School bus rider with your students, sign and return these documents to your school's main office. Almost all Corbett students will ride the bus at some point in the year either for field trips or sports trips. They will all need to be aware of the rules and will be expected to follow them. These rules are directly from the Oregon Department of Education and from Corbett School Board policy. LUNCH PAYMENT OPTIONS

It is the parent or guardian's responsibility to make sure their student's lunch account has available funds. Prepaying for the school year is strongly recommended. Delinquent accounts will be sent to collections.

CHILD FIND

Public schools will ensure that all students with disabilities who are eligible for kindergarten through 21 years of age, residing within their attendance area, have available to them a free and appropriate public education in the least restrictive environment. The rights of children with disabilities and their parents will be protected in accordance with state and federal laws.
