On October 18th thousands of Oregonians will "Drop, Cover, and Hold On" in The Great Oregon ShakeOut, the state's largest earthquake drill ever. All K-12 schools and districts are encouraged to participate in the drill, and the students of the Corbett School District will participate as well.

Major earthquakes may happen anywhere you live, work, or travel. The ShakeOut is our chance to practice how to protect ourselves, and for everyone to become prepared. The goal is to prevent a major earthquake from becoming a catastrophe for you, your organization, and your community.

Due to the extreme building risk of the main campus middle school, the students and staff within that building will be instructed to exit immediately, as they do during a fire drill. The other campus buildings will follow the "Drop, Cover, and Hold On" protocol.

"My favorite part is the teepees because I can practice climbing them. Even though I am a little scared of heights, I am getting better at climbing!" said 1st-grade CAPS student, Oliver Ortega. Oliver and his sister, Evie, donated their birthday money to Nature Space this summer, in addition to helping at the rummage sale and the Nature Space work party. It was dedication like this from multiple CAPS families that allowed Nature Space to come to fruition.



Two large teepees, a rock climbing wall, a stage for imaginative play, classroom use, and performances, outdoor music equipment and many logs and rocks to play on are what you will currently see at Nature Space. Leroy Smith was super generous and donated many tons of beautiful rock for our kids to play on. A special (ginormous) thanks goes to Kevin Heberling who volunteered his building and design skills to build all of the Nature Space elements over summer break. This dedication and fearless determination soared beyond our dreams and his efforts have made for one amazing place for our kids to play.



Almost 400 cubic yards of engineered wood chips were delivered to the grounds. In order to spread all the wood chips, a team of volunteers including the Hudson's, the Ortega's, the Wright's, the Jensen's, the McCormick/Bruha's, the Steichen's, and Ms. Lieuallen's family worked an entire day in the heat to get it ready for kids on the first day of school. 
CEF ADDS NEW BOARD MEMBER




