Transition years have historically created many questions and sometimes anxiety for students and parents. In an effort to support students during these years the Corbett School District will be offering a full range of building specific activities and orientation.

This year the half-day orientation in the high school building will be seeing an exciting new addition. With the help of several members of the staff and community, the Corbett Robotics team will be hosting a job fair bringing together employers from across a broad range of occupations. Students will begin the day developing potential questions for employers and completing an occupational interest survey and will finish the half day visiting with employers represented at the fair. The orientation day runs from 7:55 to 12:30 on Monday, August 26th, and is a required school day for all students, grades 8-12. This should be an exciting morning and we're hoping it will be the first of many to come.

Bus transportation will be available for all students who normally ride the bus. Lunch will be available before students return home.

It's most helpful to submit this at the start of the school year, but if your financial situation changes, this form can be submitted at any point in time.

LUNCH PAYMENT OPTIONS

It is the parent or guardian's responsibility to make sure their student's lunch account has available funds. Prepaying for the school year is strongly recommended. Your options are: cash, checks, or credit card via MealTime online. Delinquent accounts will be sent to collections. *Remember, good old homemade sack lunches are always an option to avoid lunch charges.*

BUS SAFETY & CODE of CONDUCT

Whether riding the bus on a daily basis, or just for field trips and sports trips, please make sure your students are aware of and following the following rules:

While riding a school bus, students will:

1. Obey the driver at all times;
2. Not throw objects;
3. Not have in their possession any weapon as defined by Board policy JFCJ - Weapons in the Schools;
4. Not fight, wrestle or scuffle;
5. Not stand up and/or move from seats while the bus is in motion;
6. Not extend hands, head, feet, or objects from windows or doors;
7. Not possess matches or other incendiaries and concussion devices;
8. Use emergency exits only as directed by the driver;
9. Not damage school property or the personal property of others;
10. Not threaten or physically harm the driver or other riders;
11. Not do any disruptive activity which might cause the driver to stop in order to reestablish order;
12. Not make disrespectful or obscene statements;
13. Not possess and/or use tobacco, alcohol or illegal drugs;
14. Ask for the driver's approval to eat or chew gum;
15. Not carry glass containers or other glass objects;
16. Not take onto the bus skateboards, musical instruments, or other large objects which might pose safety risks or barriers to safe entry and exit from the bus;
17. Accept assigned seats;
18. Stay away from the bus when it is moving;
19. Be at the bus stop five minutes before the scheduled pick up time (schedules will be posted on all buses);
20. Answer to coaches, teachers and chaperons who are responsible for maintaining order on trips.

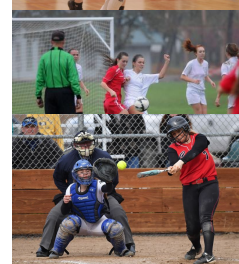
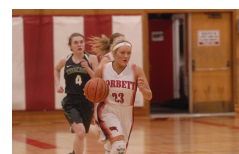

Notification letters have been sent to students meeting the qualifications for receiving a scholarship from our program for this upcoming school year. Responses can only be accepted if sent using the US Postal Service or hand-delivered to the school district office. Online or email submissions are not acceptable. Failure to meet the outlined steps will result in forfeiture of the potential scholarship.

Strengthening Community Through Improved Education

CHILD FIND

Public schools will ensure that all students with disabilities who are eligible for kindergarten through 21 years of age, residing within their attendance area, have available to them a free and appropriate public education in the least restrictive environment. The rights of children with disabilities and their parents will be protected in accordance with state and federal laws.

School districts must locate and identify individuals who have disabilities from birth to age 21. If you or someone you know has a child with a disability who may be in need of special education and related services, you can initiate a referral through your local schools. 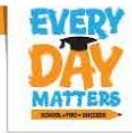

Too Sick for School?

Students can go to school if:

- They have a runny nose or little cough, but no other symptoms.
- They haven't taken any fever-reducing medicine for 24 hours, and have been fever-free during that time.
- They haven't thrown up or had diarrhea for 24 hours.

Keep students home if:

- They have a temperature higher than 100 degrees even after taking medicine.
- They are throwing up or have diarrhea.
- Their eyes are pink and crusty.

Call the doctor if:

- They have a temperature higher than 100 degrees for more than two days.
- They've been throwing up or have diarrhea for more than two days.
- They've had the sniffles for more than a week, and aren't getting better.

These are generally accepted guidelines. Every body is different. If you are unsure, ask your health care provider or call your school.
