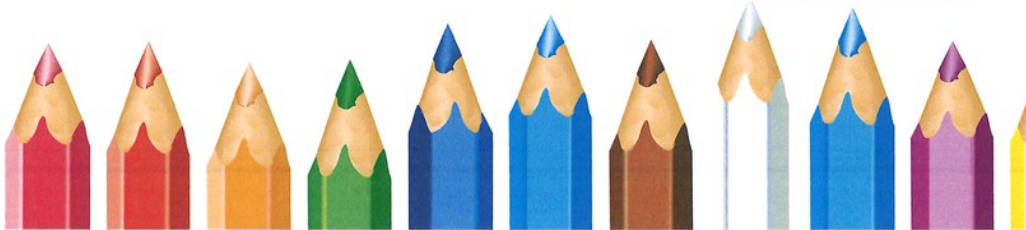

FROM THE HEALTH ROOM:

Field trips are once again happening at Corbett! The Health Room staff would like to remind parents/guardians of a few things that will make it safer for your student if they have a chronic health condition:

Let the Health Room staff know if your student has any allergies; especially if they cause a severe allergic reaction.

1. School stock Epi-pens do not go on school field trips, so if your student has a severe allergic reaction to any food/environment factor/insect sting, please bring an extra Epi-pen to school. This would go with your child on the field trip.
2. Bring any medication that your student needs in the bottle/box that has the pharmacy label. This is our doctor/healthcare provider's order that we follow.
3. If your student has a chronic health condition requiring any type of medication or intervention; please make sure the Health Room staff are aware.
4. Any medications given, whether prescription or non-prescription, requires a parent to sign the appropriate authorization form. Debbie Baker, Health Assistant or Julie Nakamura, RN will be happy to assist you. Please call the Health Room at: 503-261-4258.

Last, please remember that school exclusion day is April 20, 2022. "All children who are not up-to-date or complete on immunization will be excluded from their school." ([Multnomah County, 2022](#)). Your Health Team is ready to assist you with any questions.

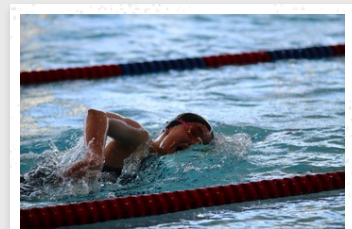

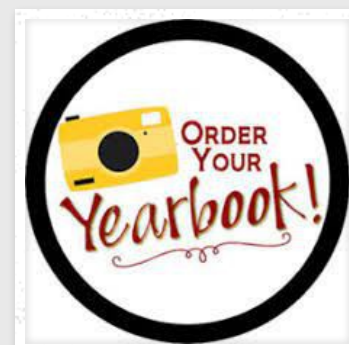


PURCHASE YOUR HIGHSCHOOL YEARBOOKS NOW!

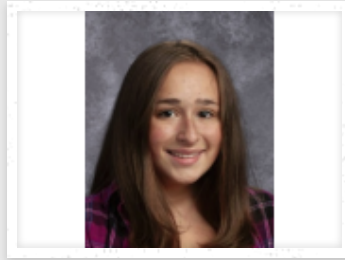

- She is responsible and caring to all students and staff. -Hannah Lambert



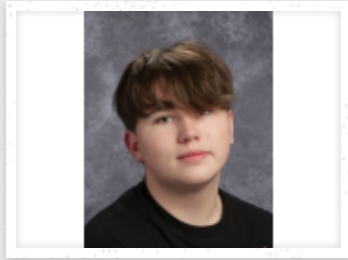
9TH GRADE: SYDNEY BILYEU

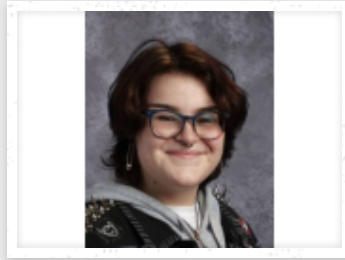
10TH GRADE: AVA BLATCHFORD
